An Alberta Health Services employee who is working at Lethbridge Corrections reached out asking for literature for addicts to read during their stay there. H&I supplied them with a few copies of How it Works and Why, Step Working Guides (both of which were donated by a member) and 5 Basic Texts that were donated by H&I. I did reach out and offer support in possible setting up a meeting or panel meeting at that facility. She has not yet responded.

I am continuing to take the pseudo-outreach trips. I have had a few members join me, and look forward to the next trips at the end of July. I will be out of country July 2 to the 18th and will not be available to support NA.

I still need more time to complete the ASC AGM P&P change. I aim to have it ready for the July ASC for GSR and group review.

Introduction

This past weekend the Regional Service Committee met in Lloydminster our RD ALT, Chair, and Vice Chair, along with members from the Chinook area, Central Alberta area, Central Sask area, Southern Sask Area, and the Edmonton area in attendance.

Nominations

As was mentioned in the last report there are a number of positions available at the Regional table. The position of secretary has been open for some time now and we would like to have a nomination put forward at our next RSC, so if you are interested or know someone that would be interested please let me know ASAP. Other positions available are Chair, Vice Chair, PR Chair, RD, and RD ALT.

What is the Region up to?

There were three new WorkGroups struck this weekend.

The first one comes from the results of the GSR assembly in April. The Region will be creating three new workshops:

1. NA service positions at the area level
2. Unity at the Area and Group level using spiritual principles
3. How to deal with violent and disruptive behavior including sexual harassment and bullying

The second work group will deal with how the Region can become more involved in the Regional Convention. We will look at holding the RSC in conjunction with the Convention, as well as Regional members taking shifts at the registration or literature table etc.

The third will deal with the future of the GSR assembly. They will be creating a GSR assembly handbook as well as looking at updating or changing the format and the questions asked.

The Region has also received requests to put on workshops for the Edmonton area and South Sask area. The Edmonton workshop will be on CBDM and will happen at their Area meeting and the South Sask will be titled Reinvigorating recovery through service and will be happening at their upcoming convention.

For the Area

The Region needs the Area to make a decision on whether the Area wants to host the 2020 Regional Convention as it will be Chinooks turn in the rotation. Keep in mind this **does not** have to be in Calgary, it could take place anywhere in our area.

We also need to set a time to complete a CANA/ACNA scan. This is a relatively short document and will only take roughly half an hour to complete. We request to have time to complete this at the July ASC.
